## Wales Mammal Biodiversity Action Forum (WMBAF)

Work Programme - April 2013 – March 2014

## **Terms of Reference**

The work of this group will be conducted in accordance with the Terms of Reference submitted to the Species Expert Group (ToR v3, April 2010).

## Work Programme

- 1. Provide specialist mammal advice to Wales Biodiversity Partnership's (WBP) Species Expert Group (SEG) through updates from meetings, papers produced and meetings with SEG or Ecosystem Group (EG) members as required.
- 2. Speak to Action Leads to see if there are projects that need to be flagged up and taken forward. Consider what projects are underway for species.
- 3. Provide a forum for dialogue between statutory and voluntary organisations involved in the delivery of conservation action for Wales' mammal BAP species via 2 meetings and dissemination of minutes and papers.
- 4. Produce Species Action Plans and Species Conservation Strategies as outlined in the "Summary of Wales BAP Mammals" document, February 2010 and disseminate to LBAP partnerships.
- 5. Consider a mechanism for reviewing the suite of Action Plans and Strategies and updating them as necessary.
- 6. Request reports from SEG and EGs on progress on Mammal BAP Actions and ensure that reporting of BAP Actions on BARS is undertaken by Species Leads and / or EGs.
- 7. Consider how to encourage the submission of mammal data to Wales and UK recording systems (via LRCs and the NBN Gateway).
- 8. Continue information exchange on progress with conservation work and issues pertaining to the different areas of Wales and the UK (including habitat connectivity and landscape-scale projects).
- 9. Maintain links with LBAPS and UK BAP groups and other relevant groups.
- 10. Produce an Annual Progress Bulletin on work undertaken in this programme.
